## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

<b>Application Schedule</b>	<p>Summer Program (Vannes): March 15 (<i>for LICET summer program, please consult your home university</i>)</p> <p>Fall semester or entire academic year: April 1 - May 30</p> <p>Spring semester: September 1 - October 31</p>
<b>Application procedures for incoming students</b>	<p>The home university performs their internal selection process to choose the students going to Icam. The home university then emails the details of the nominated students to the <b>Icam International Programs coordinator</b>: <a href="mailto:catherine.maury@icam.fr">catherine.maury@icam.fr</a></p> <p>Including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student's full name and email address</li> <li>• Field of studies at the home institution</li> <li>• Level of studies (Bachelor/ Master)</li> <li>• Period of exchange: Fall/Winter Semester - Spring/Summer Semester Semester – Full year</li> <li>• Type of exchange program: classes-scientific project-Double Degree-summer program, etc.</li> </ul> <p>The respective International Relations Office campus will then send the application documents to the students.</p>
<b>Requested documentation (sent by email)</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Application form printed and signed by the applicant with the stamp and signature of the partner university</li> <li>2. Passport or ID: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Copy of passport for non-European students</li> <li>○ Copy of passport or European ID Card for European students</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. One ID Picture in JPEG format</li> <li>4. Certificate of enrolment at the home university</li> <li>5. Health Insurance <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ for European students: copy of the European Health Insurance student card</li> <li>○ for non-European students: copy of international health insurance</li> </ul> </li> <li>6. Official transcript of records</li> </ol>
<b>VISA Requirement</b>	<p>All applicants from non-European countries need a visa to study in France. In order to get it, the students can contact Campus France or apply at the embassy or consulate of France in their home country.</p>

## ACADEMIC INFORMATION

<b>Semester dates</b>	<p>Summer Program (Vannes): June-July</p> <p>Year B3 : September - end of January &amp; February - beginning of June</p> <p>Year M1 : end of September - end of January &amp; beginning of February - beginning of July</p> <p>Year M2 : beginning of September - mid February &amp; beginning of February - beginning of July</p>
<b>Orientation Week</b>	<p>Third week of September or First week of February (Information, French courses...)</p>

<b>Study plans</b>	Exchange students can choose different programs (B3, M1 or M2 semester/year). They can check the syllabus of each one on our website.
<b>Transcripts of Records</b>	A copy of the transcript of records will be sent directly to the home institution and to the student by email.
<b>Language Requirements</b>	<p>Most classes are taught in French although some are taught in English. Language requirements may vary depending on the selected program. In general however, the language requirements are as follows:</p> <p>French : A2+ level Certificate or equivalent is recommended but not a must</p> <p>For Year M1, students have the option to do the first semester entirely in English at the Toulouse campus. The applicant should have a sufficient level in French (A2+ recommended) or English (B2 recommended) to follow classes without any difficulty.</p>
<b>Grades</b>	The grading system at Icam is the European grading system.
<b>Exams and evaluations</b>	Depending on the course, the type of exams or points of evaluation may differ. Written exams, oral exams, multiple choice questions, essay and group projects are common ways for a teacher to evaluate the students. This document explains <a href="#">Icam's assessment method</a> in more detail.
<b>French language courses</b>	Exchange students have access to French language courses without any extra charge. The courses are taken into account in their schedule.
<b>Bachelor Project and Master Thesis</b>	<p>Icam's teaching methodology is very project-based, be it at Bachelor or Master level.</p> <p>Each thesis will be done under the supervision of an experienced project manager. This offers the exchange students the possibility to work with firms under industrial contracts, or to contribute to ongoing research activities at Icam labs.</p> <p>The thesis can be conducted along with courses, or as the core academic activity of the semester. Project-based activities will be mostly done in English (B2-level recommended). Basic level of French (A2-level) is recommended to handle the normal day-to-day life in France.</p>

## STUDENT LIFE INFORMATION

<b>Accommodation</b>	Each Icam campus has its own student residence. The dorm manager will contact and send the documents to apply for a room once the student's application has been accepted.
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## HEALTH INSURANCE INFORMATION

<b>Requirements</b>	<p>Your health insurance has to cover:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Medical, surgical, pharmaceutical hospitalization and ambulances expenses</li><li>• repatriation or medical transport in case of illness or injury</li><li>• Assistance services (medical evacuation and repatriation to home country)</li><li>• Personal liability (coverage of damage caused to third party, housing included)</li><li>• Work accident (for internship)</li></ul>
<b>Insurance policy</b>	<p>EU students are required to hold the European Health Insurance Card. Please do not forget to get the card from your health insurance provider before coming to France.</p>
